Pastor's Ponderings

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

By now most of us have been dug out, (or maybe are still digging out) from the snowstorm. Roofs are heavy with snow, driveways are lined with tall white banks, and the ordinary rhythms of daily life have been interrupted. Schools were closed, meetings were postponed, and travel plans were put on hold. For a few days, the world felt quieter, slower, and more fragile than usual. And yet—there was also something strangely beautiful about it all.

The silence after the snow fell. The way the sunlight sparkled across untouched fields. The neighbors helping neighbors with shovels and snowblowers. The gentle reminder that, for all our planning and productivity, we are still deeply dependent on one another—and on God.

In many ways, this storm feels like an unexpected parable for where we are in the church year.

We are nearing the end of Epiphany, a season when we reflect on how Christ is revealed in the world. And soon, on February 18, we will enter the season of Lent—a season of repentance, reflection, and renewed trust in God's mercy. Lent invites us to slow down, to take stock of our lives, and to notice where we are being called back into deeper faithfulness.

Snowstorms force us to slow down. Lent invites us to do the same. Both remind us that we are not in control of everything. Both create space for stillness, prayer, and re-centering our lives on God.

Perhaps the snowstorm disrupted your plans. Perhaps it revealed just how tired you've been. Perhaps it stirred anxiety, grief, or frustration. Or perhaps it gave you a rare moment of quiet grace.

Wherever you found yourself in the middle of it all, please know this: God was present there too, loving you. God was present in the sound of shovels scraping the sidewalk. God was present in the text messages checking in on one another. God was present in the simple gift of being safe and sheltered.

As we move into February, I invite you to carry that awareness forward. God is not only found in worship on Sunday mornings. God is not only found in the "good" or "productive" moments of life. God is also found in the interruptions, the inconveniences, the waiting, and the quiet.

On Ash Wednesday, we will hear the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Those words are not meant to frighten us. They are meant to remind us that we are finite, vulnerable, and deeply loved. They call us to humility and hope at the same time.

This February, as winter lingers and Lent approaches, may we be a people who move gently through the world—more patient, more prayerful, more attentive to God's presence in one another.

Thank you for the ways you continue to care for one another, especially in times of disruption and difficulty. Even after the storm, God's grace is still falling all around us.

To God Be the Glory, Great Things He Has Done! 50 Years (1976 – 2026)

Dear Friends and Partners of the Desai Princeton ISI Ministry,

Greetings in the name of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ! We are reaching out on behalf of Aruna Desai to share with you the news of her retirement from ministry. February 2026 will mark the 50th anniversary of the start of the ministry of John and Aruna Desai in Princeton, through International Students, Inc. (ISI). Even before John was suddenly called to the presence of the Lord last January, he and Aruna had prayerfully decided that the 50th ministry anniversary would be God's perfect time for them to retire. Staying faithful to their decision, Aruna will step down from her staff role with ISI effective February 1, 2026.

Having come from India in January 1975 to get a graduate degree at Princeton Theological Seminary, little did John know of what the Lord had in store for him and Aruna. A year later in February 1976, Aruna and daughters Eva and Mona joined him. ISI invited them to start the Princeton chapter of ISI. *Through your help and support over the past fifty years*, John and Aruna have ministered to and significantly impacted—here in the US and around the world—the lives of international students/scholars and their families from at least 150 countries, as well as the lives of countless ministry partners. Aruna, and certainly John if he were still alive, cannot thank you enough for your prayers and support over the years. You have helped make it possible for them to reach the nations for Jesus, while forging relationships, some of which will last a lifetime.

Though no longer staff, Aruna is committed to globally impact the lives of internationals for eternity. Her retirement means that she will no longer be raising ministry support. **ISI will cease receiving donations to her account as of February 1, 2026.** Any donations received after that date will be returned to donors.

Aruna wholeheartedly commends ISI's ministry. Please prayerfully consider continuing your faithful support of the Princeton ministry to international students by contributing to ISI's new team leaders, Bob & Carrie Louer (#5500), or donate to ISI's National Ministry Fund (NMF).

Again, we are so grateful for your generosity, prayers, and encouragement through the years, partnering with John and Aruna Desai to reach the world for Jesus!

May the Lord's peace remain always with your family and you.

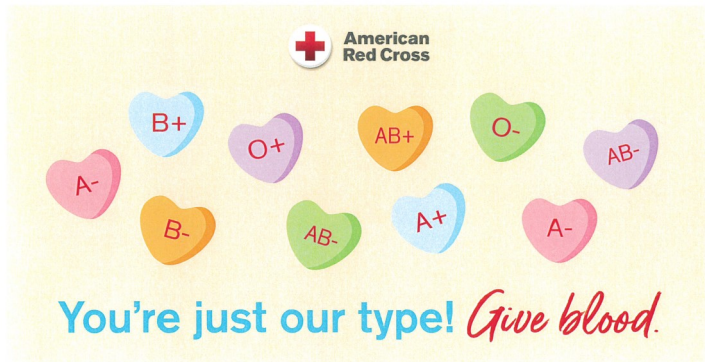
