CALL TO CONFESSION

In this season of watching and waiting, we are reminded that the light shines in the darkness, yet we often choose the shadows. Christ calls us to stay awake, to be ready, to make room for God's kingdom. Trusting in the God who comes to us with mercy and hope, let us turn from what is broken and turn toward the One who makes all things new. Let us confess our sin together.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION
