From Pastor Barbara

"Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." Isaiah 1:18.

As I sit at the window, watching the fluffy snowflakes slowly float down to settle into their appointed places, I am filled with gratitude for the many blessings I have had by being called to KMPC. The beauty of this area is awesome and inviting. The snowfalls have brought a refreshing and new glimpse of the landscape as well as giving us a foretaste of all the beauty that will come. We can see the beauty in nature and accept the forgiveness Christ offers to cleanse us from our sins, making them white as snow.

We are in the season of Epiphany. An epiphany happens when suddenly a concept or idea becomes clear. It is like turning on a light bulb in the dark, where suddenly you can see or understand something that was unseen, or not understood before.
